Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Now that the November 2008 election in the history books, we can reflect back upon our pro-choice victories and losses. In this issue you will find information about our work during this election season and our victories at nearly every level, all the way from the White House to the State House.

Barack Obama Elected President!

Pro-Choice Minnesotans spoke loud and clear on November 4th and overwhelmingly supported the fully pro-choice candidate Barack Obama.

After eight years of the Bush administration's attacks on reproductive rights, the nominations of extremely anti-choice Supreme Court Justices Alito and Roberts, and failed abstinence only sex education, the time for change has come. President-elect Obama has a proven track record of defending reproductive rights. He supports age appropriate sex education and he has the courage and wisdom to appoint Supreme Court Justices who will defend Roe v. Wade.

As Senator, Barack Obama was a sponsor of the Freedom of Choice Act. If passed into law, this act could override state level abortion bans and remove the threat of the Supreme Court overturning Roe v. Wade, and a women's right to reproductive privacy will be guaranteed.

Al Franken Senate Race Undecided

Due to an incredibly close Senate vote count, an automatic recount of all votes cast for U.S. Senate has begun. NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota endorsed candidate Al Franken is currently behind in the vote count by a little over 200 votes, out of the over 2.9 million votes cast. We will keep a close eye on this process and are hopeful for a pro-choice victory in the Senate race.

Abortion-related Bans and Ballot Measures defeated in Three States

Across the nation, there was a groundswell of support to defeat dangerous and deceptive anti-choice bans and ballot measures. In South Dakota, voters rejected Measure 11, the second abortion ban to be placed on the ballot in the last two years. In Colorado, Amendment 48, an extreme anti-choice ballot measure that would have outlawed abortion and threatened birth control and stem-cell research by establishing legal protections for fertilized eggs, was soundly defeated. And in California, Proposition 4, an extreme anti-choice ballot measure that would have jeopardized the safety of the state's most vulnerable teens, was also defeated by voters.

This election cycle has brought new energy and members into the electoral process.

At NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota, volunteers and staff knocked on over 9,000 doors and made over 19,000 phone calls, showing the power of our voices. Our next goal must be to ensure that this energy does not dissipate and that we take advantage of the opportunity presented to us. We must all continue to raise our voices for choice as we fight for reproductive freedom.

Thank you for your past support of efforts at the ballot box and the State Capitol. A new chapter of our work is just beginning and I look forward to working with you in our new and challenging work.

Looking to the 2009 Legislative Session

The 2009 legislative session looks to be one of the most challenging for Minnesotans in some time as all projections to date predict that Minnesota we will have a large budget shortfall. Given that deficit and the current economic situation, much of the legislature's focus will be taken up by financial matters.

One of our main goals at NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota is to ensure that programs dealing with reproductive health are not adversely affected by budget concerns.

We believe that one program that could be threatened by budget cuts will be funding for family planning services. With the state's financial situation, there is little doubt that Governor Pawlenty will try and cut services that are essential to preventing unintended pregnancies. Coupling that with the Governor's extremist anti-choice views, **it is possible that the Governor would attempt massive cuts to family planning** while using that money to ensure that the state continues to fund Crisis Pregnancy Centers through the Positive Alternatives program. One of our top legislative priorities at NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota will be to prevent vital family planning dollars being cut or redirected. **We will continue to fight for real measures that prevent unintended pregnancies.**

We also anticipate further debate on the healthcare reform initiatives started during the last legislative session. There are many organizations preparing for a major push to expand healthcare coverage for Minnesotans. **NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota is involved in these discussions and will fight to ensure that reproductive health continues to be covered under any form of healthcare reform.** We will stand up to any measures that would strip funding of reproductive health care from existing health program.

Finally, **we will fight any and all anti-choice amendments or bills brought forward by our anti-choice opponents.** We have been successful for the past two years in defeating all anti-choice efforts and will continue to be a strong advocate in protecting reproductive choice.

Minnesota 2008 Election Results

While we saw many pro-choice victories, the 2008 Election cycle has brought a few defeats. We fought many hard battles, and we lost some strong supporters along the way. But we were also able to elect several strong new voices who we believe will carry the torch for choice. **In the end, the Minnesota House is still a mixed-choice body.**

Overall, NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota endorsed 76 candidates, and 62 of them were elected. That is an 82% success rate! Among these legislators are six new pro-choice representatives. In 2009, we welcome to the State House of Representatives:

These legislators were some of the cause's strongest supporters and they will be greatly missed. **We would like to say a special thank you to Ron Erhardt, who had been a strong advocate for choice for 18 years in the Minnesota House of Representatives.** He was the last pro-choice Republican in the legislature. His strong principles and courage will lead a void in the legislature that cannot easily be filled.

Organizing Voters on Minnesota Campuses

During the first two months of the school year on campuses throughout the state, NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota campus representatives were busy getting new and young voters to vote pro-choice!

Our student leaders on 16 campuses throughout the state:

- Conducted 39 election education trainings
- Registered 398 voters
- Submitted 11 letters to the editor to their school papers, and 9 were published
- Coordinated 21 Get Out the Vote activities
- Planned four "Get Out the Pro-Choice Vote" visibility activities
- Distributed same day voter registration education to 2650 potential new voters
- Held 21 candidate specific election phone banks, lit drops and tabling activities

NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota runs one of the largest and most effective campus programs in the United States. We organize on campuses through out the state and are building the next generation of pro-choice leaders. Our campuses include: Carleton College, Gustavus Adolphus College, Hamline University, Macalester College, Minnesota State University - Mankato, Minneapolis Community and Technical College, Metropolitan State University, Minnesota State University- Bemidji, Minnesota State University - Moorhead, Minnesota State University - Saint Cloud , Rochester Community and Technical College, Saint Olaf College, the University of Minnesota - Duluth, the University of Minnesota - Morris, the University of Minnesota - Twin Cities, and Minnesota State University - Winona.



NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota's Canvass and their Vital Role in Election 2008

NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota played a key role in the U.S. Senate race this year. Our phone canvassers made approximately 12,000 dials to our members and three pro-choice Franken mail pieces were sent to approximately 6,000 members. Throughout the program, we were able to have conversations with our members about supporting the best candidate for choice. We had an impact on this race, and considering how close it is, this race may have been an outright loss without our work.

At the state level, our field canvassers knocked on over 2,000 doors in House Districts 16A and 49B. Our efforts resulted in the election of new pro-choice legislators Gail Kulick Jackson and Representative Jerry Newton.

The phone canvassers dialed almost 1,600 NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota members into House Districts 41B and 53A. Our efforts resulted in the election of new pro-choice legislator Paul Rosenthal and the reelection of Paul Gardner.

Overall, NARAL Pro-Choice Minnesota volunteers and staff knocked on over 9,000 doors and made over 19,000 phone calls, showing the power of our voices. Our next goal must be to ensure that this energy does not dissipate and that we take advantage of the opportunity presented to us. We must all continue to raise our voices for choice as we fight for reproductive freedom.
